Talk about changes like melting, dissolving and growing.
Describe how different materials feel and think about what they can be used for.

Understanding the World

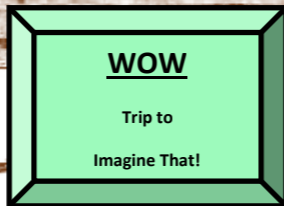
Read and follow a recipe
