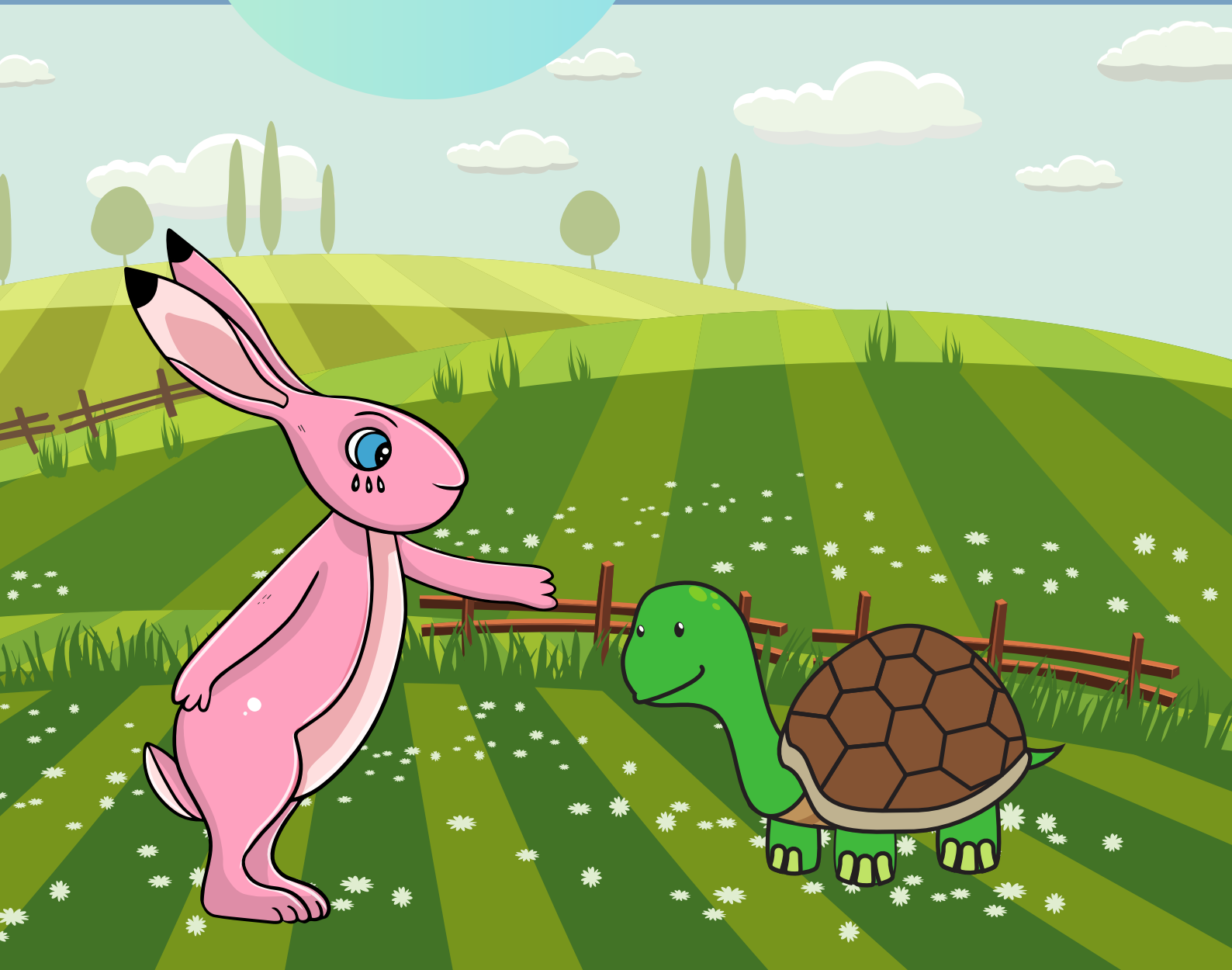
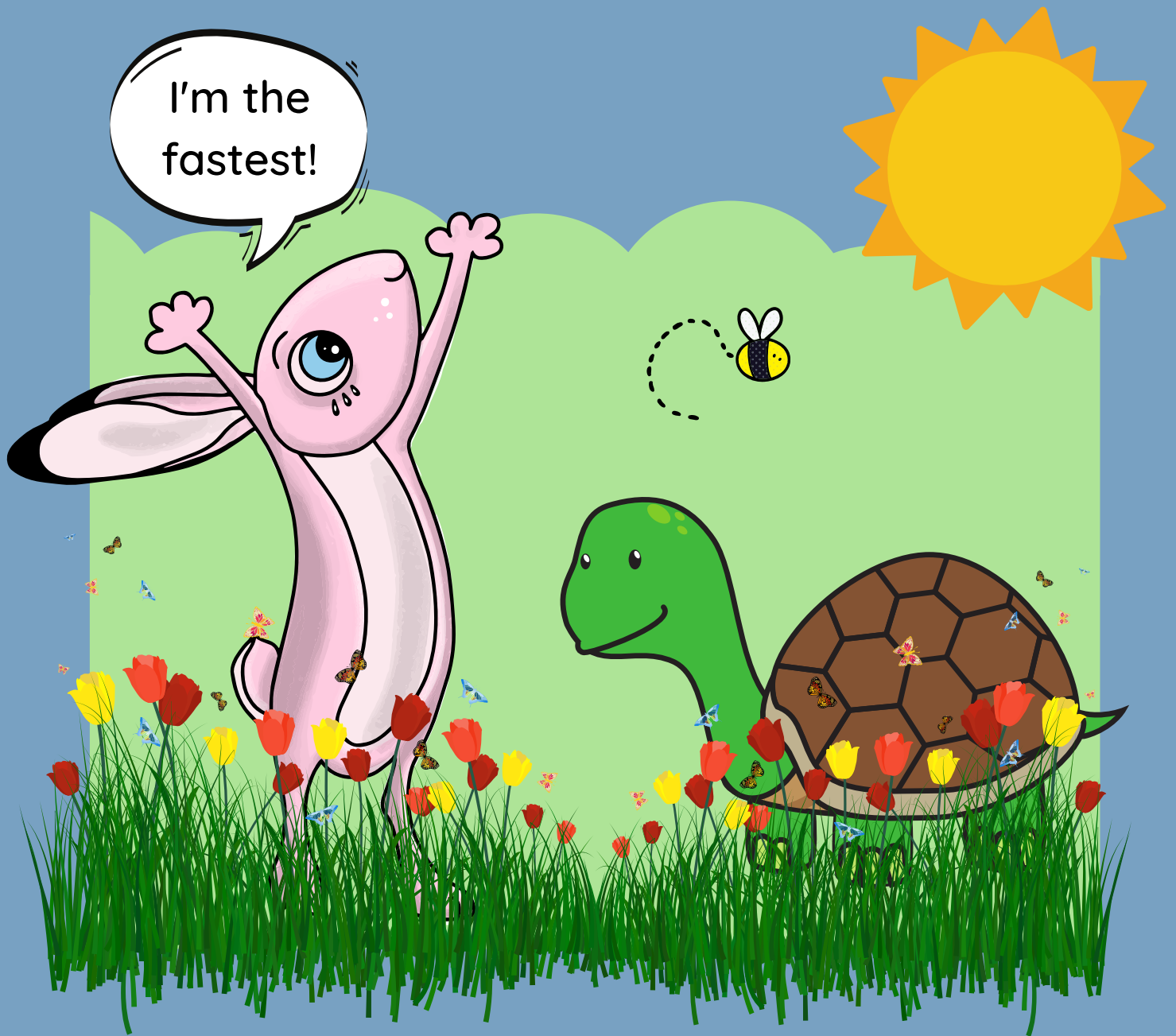


Tortoise and Hare
